## Message from Mrs Rothenburg

A warm welcome back to our Summer term.

This is one of the busiest terms with so many exciting and important events taking place. Some of the key dates for this term are listed at the end of this newsletter. We are still finalising a few others dates and times, these will be added onto the newsletter next week.

As the warmer weather is upon us; we will hopefully see plenty of sunshine. In order to help keep your child safe in the sun, please can you ensure the following:

- Before your child comes to school, high protection sun-cream is applied (ideally factor 30+).
- This application may be sufficient for some children, especially with some of the longer lasting creams. However, if you wish for your child to apply a top up of sun-cream, please bring a bottle of sun-cream, with their name on, to leave in school.

Please note that although we are unable to apply the cream directly for children, we are able to help them, for example by spraying the sun-cream with a push/spray application, so they can then rub it in. (This will allow us to help younger children or those who are unable to apply the cream independently).

- Please ensure your child also brings a water bottle, with their name on and a hat to school each day. This will help to keep your child safe in the sun and allow them to enjoy playing in it!

As you may be aware, there are new signs outside of school, near the zig zags, clearly reminding everyone about the parking restrictions. The Police have dropped in and agreed to monitor the parking outside of school, this includes the parking and blocking of residents' driveways. After several complaints by residents, school and the emergency services, they have made it clear that tickets will be issued for illegal parking. Thankfully this week, the parking outside of school at the end of the day, has improved greatly and hopefully this will continue to be the case.

## School Council News
